Peter Barnacle is General Counsel for the Canadian Association of University Teachers (CAUT). A former high school teacher and union activist, Peter has practiced labour and related law on behalf of trade unions and employee associations for 30 years through an almost equal division between private practice in Victoria, Ottawa and Saskatoon, and in-house counsel with the Canadian Air Traffic Control Association, Canadian Union of Public Employees and, in the UK and Ireland, the National Union of Journalists.

Peter is active in international labour organizations and worked extensively with trade unions in Uganda, where he was also an adjunct professor in international human rights law at Makerere University, Kampala. He was a research associate at the Industrial Relations Centre at Queen's University, and has written several books and numerous articles on domestic and international labour-related topics. Peter is the principal revising author of the legal text *Employment Law in Canada*, an ad-hoc and sessional university lecturer and frequently a speaker and panelist at labour law and related conferences.
